WHAT IS THE STUDY ABOUT?

- A project designed to compare two ways for supporting the families of children with attention-deficit/hyperactivity disorder (ADHD).
- This project does NOT provide medication for the management of ADHD symptoms, but includes children who may or may not be on medication for the treatment of ADHD.

WHAT IS THE GOAL OF THE STUDY?

- To determine if one approach for children with ADHD is better than the other.

WHO CAN TAKE PART IN THE STUDY?

- Families of children ages 5 to 11 who have ADHD.
- Families of children who receive their primary care at the Karabots, Cobbs Creek, Drexel Hill, Media, Broomall, Roxborough, or South Philadelphia practices in the CHOP Care Network.
- Children who do or don't take medication to treat ADHD.
- Children not currently receiving behavior therapy.

WHEN AND WHERE IS THE PROGRAM HELD AND WHAT IS THE COST?

- The program is held at the five primary care practices targeted for this study.
- There is no cost for participating in study evaluation activities.
- Study interventions will be billed to the child's mental health insurance.
