



CHILDREN NEEDED FOR STUDY OF GENDER DEVELOPMENT AND SEX DIFFERENCES IN AUTISM

WHAT ARE THE GOALS OF THIS RESEARCH STUDY?

The goal of this research study is to investigate gender development and sex differences in children who are on the autism spectrum and children who are not on the autism spectrum.

WHO CAN BE A PART OF THIS STUDY?

This study is looking to partner with children ages 4-8 with a confirmed diagnosis of autism, as well as typically developing children.

WHAT WILL PARTICIPANTS BE ASKED TO DO?

Participants will be invited to four study visits (6 months apart each, over the course of 2 years) in-person to interview with a member of the research team. The visits will involve behavioral and clinical assessments, such as parent and child questionnaires and eye tracking measurements.

Participants will be compensated for their time and travel.
