



TEENS & YOUNG ADULTS ON THE AUTISM SPECTRUM & PARENTS NEEDED FOR TRANSPORTATION STUDY

WHAT ARE THE GOALS OF THIS RESEARCH STUDY?

The purpose of this study is to learn more about the experience of teens and young adults on the autism spectrum and their parents as they make decisions about transportation, including driving.

WHO CAN BE A PART OF THIS STUDY?

This study is open to autistic teens and young adults ages 16 – 21, who do not yet have a learner's permit or driver's license, and a parent.

WHAT WILL PARTICIPANTS BE ASKED TO DO?

Participants will be invited to complete up to 6 web-based surveys over the course of two years, where they will be asked about their experiences, perspectives, and decisions regarding transportation and driving. No in-person visits are required. They will receive compensation for their participation.

WHAT ARE THE BENEFITS?

The information collected in this study may benefit future families with teens on the autism spectrum, and all young drivers.
